Do I need to keep my child off school?



Once your child is registered at a school, you are responsible for making sure they attend regularly.

Pre-School

The children made vegetable soup with their friends. The children explored the vegetables, talking about their names, shape, size and colour. Then they sat in small groups with a supporting adult who modelled safe cutting techniques. The children all had a go at cutting the vegetables and put them into the pan. Year 1

In Year 1 we are really enjoying our latest class book 'Traction Man'. We can't wait to read all about his adventures. In maths, we are using number lines and 100 squares to help us understand place value of numbers to 100. We have started to learn about the seasons in science and we are learning the names of the four countries in the UK and their capital cities in geography. In computing we have been using drawing tools to create art work in the style of Piet Mondrian as well as basic skills such as logging on, saving our work and logging off safely.







Year 2

We have had a wonderful start to the new term in Year 2. In Maths, we have been focusing on subtraction and the different methods we can use to find the answer. In English we have started a new story book called 'The Egg Box Dragon.' The children are enjoying the book so far and have used their fantastic imaginations to discuss what is going to happen next! We have started new topics of D & T and Geography. Over the next few weeks we will be designing and creating our own gift boxes and have already designed maps of the school! Lastly, we have even started learning our new songs for the nativity and we are very excited to perform to our adults in a few weeks' time.









Year 3

Year 3 had an awesome afternoon at the Guildhall watching a dance performance hosted by Strike a Light. The show had music, lights and dance - a fully immersive experience. Mrs James even convinced the Mayor of Gloucester to come to say hello whilst we waited, who even answered some of our questions.







Year 4

The children are fully engaged with the new writing text, 'How the Stars Came to Be'. The book is so colourful and really draws the children in. We cannot wait to see their explanations on constellations and how the solar system is formed. Over the next few weeks we will be rapidly learning multiplication fats and their related division facts. Please encourage your child to practise at home.

In October, PE had the focus on the development of ball skills. By applying these skills to the game of rugby, they have not only improved their coordination but also learned the importance of teamwork and strategy. This will continue this term however we will apply the skills to the game of basketball instead. To ensure the continuation of their physical development, we kindly request that your child's PE kit is in school for the whole term.

Year 5

On the 15th November, year 5 enjoyed a walk around Matson to develop their map skills in geography. We took our maps out, plotted our route and identified key features that we could add to our map. We also came across the flock of local sheep!! We are all experts at reading maps and we were even able to draw our own maps of our walk when we returned to school.







Year 6

This term year 6 met Candice, our local PCSO and Schoolbeat officer. They completed their first session with her all about keeping safe online.
